Mr. Pratt has been a resident of Redlands but a few years. Before coming here he was a practicing attorney in New York City, being a graduate of Bowdoin College and the New York Law School. He is proprietor of the City Transfer company, is a man of education, without ostentation and one of great personal force of character whenever called upon to exhibit such qualifications. He is popular among educators and educated men, and is performing the duties of the executive officer of the University club, in the absence of the president, Dr. C.E. Ide, who is traveling abroad.
